REVEREND CINDY FALCO-DI CORRADO

I, Reverend (hereinafter Rev.) *Cindy Falco* aka *Rev. Cindy Falco- Di Corrado* with domicile at 316 N.W.1st Avenue, Boynton Beach, Florida; Phone: 904-501-3082 as one People of "We The People" in Sui Juris with all due respect, within the best way to proceed, with the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, not misleading, declares as follows:

1. On May 17th, 2021 *Rev. Cindy Falco-Di Corrado* went to the Delray Beach County Court to The Clerk of Court located at: 200 W. Atlantic Avenue Delray Beach, Florida to procure certified copies of documents.
2. Upon entry and after passing through the metal detector *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* was denied access to the Clerk of Courts office by *Lt. Rudy Rivera* for security. *Lt. Rudy Rivera* said that *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* needed to wear a mask and she politely shared that she is exempt. *Lt. Rudy Rivera* inquired why *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* was exempt. *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* said: "I am a Minister" it is against my religion as she stated that she does not cover the image of God. *Rev. Cindy Falco-Di Corrado* proceeded to show *Lt. Rudy Rivera* her ordination paper which he did not look at. *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* also expounded on Governor DeSantis Emergency Order that made mask wearing null and void. **(Exhibit #1 ordination paper, Exhibit #2 Palm Beach County EO 2020-12 Exhibit #3 Gov. 3. Deputy Rostaz ID# 5544 began to walk over and bully *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* and said she could not go into the Clerk of Courts Office. Deputy Rostaz Id #5544 pulled *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* aside and continued to bully *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado*. A Deputy Grunsley #9080 began to tell Deputy Rostaz #5544 to stop from speaking to *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* and inquiries about a memo. *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* was then handed a copy of the memo. **(Exhibit #4 memo).**
4. *Rev. Cindy Falco -Di Corrado* began to expound on Gov. DeSantis nullification of the Emergency Order and Deputy Rostaz ID #5544 retorts that he is just following orders. *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* inquires of why she must obey them if they do not obey Gov. DeSantis order and that *Rev. Cindy Falco-Di Corrado* is exempt and

is abiding by her unalienable rights and the mandate.

5. *Rev. Cindy Falco- Di Corrado* walked outside the building to call the clerk's office to inquire if someone could come out to service her.

6. Upon re-entry *Rev. Cindy Falco-Di Corrado* waits in the entryway before the Metal Detectors and calls and speaks with a *Stephanie* from the Clerk's office. *Stephanie*, the person who answered the phone said that she would inquire of a supervisor. Approximately 15 minutes later a woman is speaking with *Deputy Rostaz* ID# 5544 and *Deputy Grunsley* ID #9080. A supervisor never spoke with *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado*.

7. Due to lack of any communication from a Supervisor *Rev. Cindy Falco Di Corrado* re-calls the Clerk of court office to inquire about procuring her documents. *Reverened Cindy Falco- Di Corrado* is waiting for a response from another employee of the clerk's office named *Thelma* to see if someone can come in the lobby to procure the certified copies that *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* went to retrieve.

8. *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* wanted to remind the Deputies that now they are obstructing justice, and they are in violations of their oaths of office, their vow to serve the public and are committing crimes against humanity.

9.. Approximately 45 minutes later, *Deputy Grunsley* ID # 9080 calls *Rev. Cindy Falco- Di Corrado* and tells her she can go to window #19. *Rev Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* was finally able to procure her documents.

10: Upon leaving the building *Deputy Grunsley* ID #9080 opens the door and is walking in front of *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado*. *Rev. Cindy Falco- Di Corrado* says to *Deputy Grunsley* ID#9080 thanks *Deputy Grunsley* for doing the right thing.

11. Once in the parking garage *Deputy Grunsley* ID #9080 lingers back as to watch which vehicle *Rev. Cindy Falco – Di Corrado* would be getting into. This caused *Rev. Cindy Falco- Di Corrado* to fear for her safety, property, and her health.

12. Approximately 5-10 minutes later *Deputy Rastaz* ID # 5544 joins *Deputy Grunsley* #9080 out in the parking lot and they both are looking around. Shortly after *Deputy Grunsley* #9080 and *Deputy Rastaz* #5544 both go back into the building.

e. **Exemptions - Facial Coverings Not Required.** Facial coverings are not required for the following persons:

1. Children under two (2) years of age and any child while under the custody of a licensed childcare facility, including daycare centers;
2. Persons prohibited from wearing facial coverings by Federal or State safety or health regulations;
3. Public safety, fire, or other life safety personnel that have personal protective equipment requirements governed by their respective agencies;
4. Individuals while actively engaged in exercise and maintaining social distancing in accordance with CDC guidelines;
5. Persons receiving goods or services from a business or establishment for the shortest practical period of time during which the receipt of such goods or services necessarily precludes the wearing of a facial covering such as, but not limited to, consuming food or beverage or receiving a facial grooming or treatment;
6. Persons who have a medical condition that makes the wearing of a facial covering unsafe such as, but not limited to, asthma, COPD, other conditions that reduce breathing or lung capacity;
7. Persons for whom wearing a facial covering conflicts with their religious beliefs or practices; and
8. Facial coverings may be removed temporarily while assisting persons who are hearing impaired or who rely on reading lips in order to communicate.

5. A facial covering includes any covering which snugly covers the nose and mouth, whether store bought or homemade, mask or clothing covering including but not limited to, a scarf, bandana, handkerchief, or other similar cloth covering and which is secured in place. Examples of compliant homemade facial coverings may be found on the CDC website: <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/diy-cloth-face-coverings.html>. Persons wearing face coverings should review the CDC and Florida Department of Health guidelines regarding safely wearing, removing, and cleaning facial coverings. Persons should not procure N95-rated masks for general use as those are critical supplies for health care workers, law enforcement, fire-rescue, emergency management, or other persons engaged in life and safety activities. In addition, in lieu of a facial covering as defined in this section, persons may wear clear, plastic face
